Lord Kelvin Gives Back: Ruben's

Shoes



Ruben's Shoes is a local non-profit society that collects gently used shoes. The shoes are given to people in need from countries that are less fortunate. In countries like the Dominican Republic and Zimbabwe kids cannot go to school without shoes. Therefore, Ruben's Shoes gives a pair of shoes a second life, which in turn, gives people in other countries a chance at a new beginning. If a pair of shoes could give a child an education, imagine how that education could change the future for that child.

Kelly Strongitharm started Ruben's Shoes after meeting Ruben in December 2012. Upon meeting Ruben and his family, Kelly felt an immediate connection. Seeing how radically different life was for Ruben in the Dominican, Kelly felt compelled to do something to give back to the community and thus Ruben's Shoes was born.

For the past four years at Lord Kelvin, Mrs. Morson has spearheaded this initiative. Each year, shoes are collected and sent to Ruben's Shoes. Thanks to many generous donations the school community has sent hundreds of shoes to those in need of a pair of shoes.




Inclement Weather:

Winter is here and we once again want to remind parents that the district will endeavor to keep all schools open provided that safety can be ensured for students and staff. Should schools be closed, announcements will be made over **CKNW and CBC** radio stations early enough in the day (usually before 6:30 a.m.). Phone calls & emails will also be made to parents who are part of our Synervoice Automated Calling System.



Student safety is our priority and we ask that if a parent/guardian feels that a child cannot travel safely to school, then they should make alternate arrangements for their child. Student absences due to unsafe travel to school during inclement weather conditions will be excused. We also encourage parents to make advance alternate plans in the event of an unexpected school closure.

Cold and Flu Season

For the protection of your child, as well as other children, please keep your child home if he/she:

- has a fever
- is too sick to take part in all normal school activities
- has a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, pink eye, chicken pox, or any other undiagnosed rash). Please keep them home until they are no longer infectious.

Please ensure your child(ren) have warm clothing as we venture outside on most days. Time spent outdoors is an integral part of the school day.
